This is also about sea level rise & how it will affect the area (specifically around the Blue Caboose on the Mary Ellen Welch Greenway).

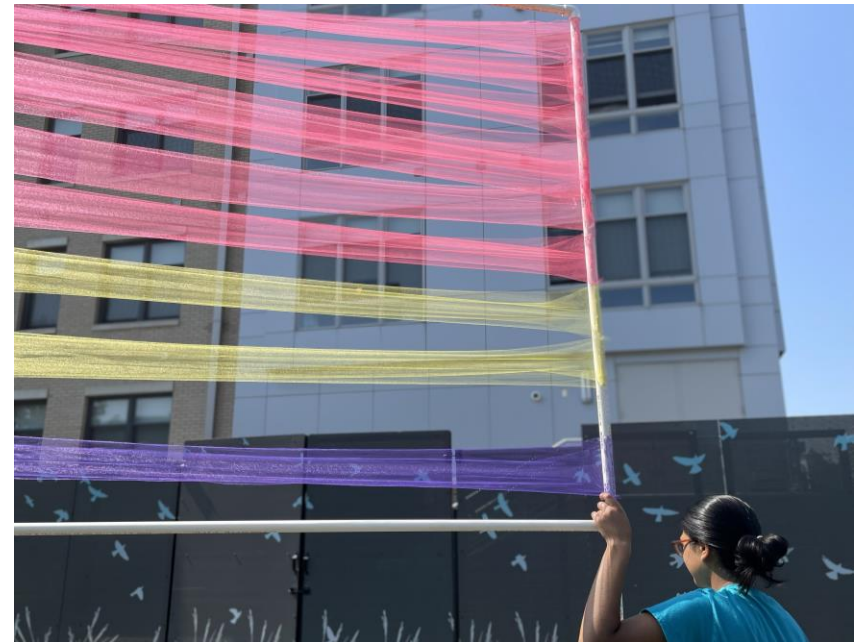
